CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Chairperson Cafarella stated the NYCCT Conference was held in Saratoga Springs on November 5 and 6. He thanked Trustees Ross and Wolfgang for attending. Trustees Ross and Wolfgang provided information from the conference.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Murabito discussed the following:

- The end of October, Dr. Murabito walked through the student built haunted house which the students worked on; they did a great job and it showed all the time and effort put into this event. He suggests this should be a multi-day viewing event.
- Dr. Murabito recently held a meeting to discuss an aviation charter school, which would be a long-term project, with an emphasis of STEM.
- Dr. Murabito continues to meet with regional community college presidents. This is being used as a sounding board as more and more questions are developed.
- Dr. Murabito attended the NYCCAP meeting held the day prior to the NYCCT conference in early November. Main topics were executive budget and workforce training.
- Dr. Murabito attended the New York State Governors Commission of National Service meeting.
- Today, Dr. Murabito and Vice President Pitman met with the Student Government Association for "Pizza with the President"; many ideas were discussed and to possibly expand the group.

- Yesterday, Dr. Murabito and Vice President Lynch toured the Bell Aerospace facility as a possible training facility for our students. Stavatti Group has a purchase offer for this facility.

- Tomorrow, Dr. Murabito and administrators will be serving the annual Thanksgiving luncheon to students. All board members are invited to participate. On Friday, the luncheon will also be offered at NFCI as takeout.
- The Annual Day of Giving will be held on November 30. Foundation Director Deb Brewer provided a few details.
- Savor Restaurant continues to be open Monday, Wednesday and Friday through December 17 for lunch and dinner. They will reopen at the end of January or early February.
- The annual holiday board dinner/meeting will be held on Monday, December 6 at Savor Restaurant.
- On November 10, we held our annual Veterans Day ceremony. Dr. Murabito wanted to share with everyone the speech which Vice Chairperson Virtuoso provided as a speaker for this event. The video presentation was viewed on the monitors. Vice Chairperson Virtuoso thanked all the veterans and she was honored to be asked to speak at the ceremony. Dr. Murabito stated next year we will be at our new Veterans Memorial location, kicking off our 60th anniversary.

ACADEMIC/STUDENT LIFE COMMITTEE

John D Strong provided information on the Resolution – Native American Heritage Day. Chairperson Cafarella read the Resolution:

Niagara County Community College (NCCC) borders the recognized lands of the Haudenosaunee people of both Seneca and Tuscarora Nations. Therefore, it is in the collective best interests of these Native American Peoples, and the institution of NCCC to live and work in harmony, and in observance of each other's role in the true American story. To that end, the following resolution is proposed.

WHEREAS, the State University of New York (SUNY) Board of Trustees passed resolution to establish a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Policy on September 10, 2015; and,

WHEREAS, many of our SUNY campuses reside on land once inhabited by the Haudenosaunee And Wenro people; and,

WHEREAS, SUNY is committed to creating campus communities that are inclusive, diverse and representative of all people system-wide.

WHEREAS, the NCCC Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) Committee was created in September 2016. It

serves as an initiative to actively engage the whole college community in recognizing the importance of diversity for assuring the success of all members of our college community, including students, staff, faculty, and administration, in an ever-increasingly global environment; and,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the NCCC Board of Trustees approve the recommendation of the EDI Committee requesting the Friday prior to Thanksgiving as *Native American Heritage Day* from this day forward and that a sustained and meaningful week-long series of events and activities to be scheduled to educate and celebrate Indigenous Peoples' histories and cultures. *Native American Heritage Day* will be listed in the College Academic Calendar.

WHEREAS, it is critical that NCCC remains competitive within the Western New York area as well as continuing to be an excellent choice for education, particularly for our Niagara County residents; and

WHEREAS, it is important to concentrate on upgrading NCCC's infrastructure and program delivery environment, so the students have a competitive advantage for future employment.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the NCCC Board of Trustees supports the College's Capital funding request for a total of \$4,940,000 contingent on the SUNY match.

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WHEREAS, the Capital Funding for this will include but is not limited to: Installation of \$300k in welding and metal working equipment secured through a grant provided by the National Science Foundation, new electrical distribution to support said equipment, installation of new HVAC systems for ventilation and fume extraction, piped gases for welding, general renovations and life safety code compliance and

WHEREAS, it is critical that NCCC remains competitive within the Western New York area as well as continuing to be an excellent choice for education, particularly for our Niagara County residents; and

WHEREAS, it is important to concentrate on upgrading NCCC's technology so the students have a competitive advantage for future employment.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the NCCC Board of Trustees supports the College's Capital funding request for a total of \$2,000,000 contingent on the SUNY match.
