Non-Matriculated Student Registration (not in a degree or certificate program)

 - Summer 2024 starting at 2 pm on Monday, March 18
 - Fall 2024 on Monday, April 8

Working closely with the incomparable Tilda Swinton (*The Chronicles of Narnia, Snowpiercer, Doctor Strange*) Sally Potter adapted Virginia Woolf's epic fantasy about a Renaissance man who lives for hundreds of years, waking up after a long nap to find that he is now a woman. Few epic films in the twentieth century address gender and art so frankly, yet the highlights involve the balance of wit and wisdom and the noteworthy filming on a budget that bear comparison to the effects in *Citizen Kane*.
