ACADEMICS



STUDY ABROAD

In May 2024, a group of SUNY Niagara students, led by Professor Bridget Beilein, embarked on an unforgettable 10-day study abroad journey through Germany, Austria, Italy, and Switzerland. The trip provided students with a unique opportunity to immerse themselves in European culture, history, and natural beauty.

Beginning in Germany, the students explored the vibrant city of Munich, participating in a walking tour that included visits to iconic landmarks such as the Munich Residenz, Marienplatz, St. Peters Church, the BMW Museum, and the historic Hofbräuhaus. Additionally, they gained a sobering understanding of Germany's past with a visit to the Dachau Concentration Camp.

The journey continued to Austria, where the students explored the picturesque city of Innsbruck. From there, they crossed the border into Italy, where they embarked on walking tours of Murano and Burano, famous for their glassblowing and lace-making traditions. In Venice, they experienced the city's unique charm through a gondola ride and a walking tour. Milan, another Italian gem, offered the students a chance to visit the Piazza del Duomo, Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, Sforzesco Castle, and Sempione Park.

The final leg of the trip took the students to Switzerland, where they explored the charming city of Lucerne, visiting the Lion Monument, Chapel Bridge, and taking a gondola ride to the top of Rigi Kulm Mountain. Their adventure concluded in Zurich, where they toured the Lindt Chocolate Museum.






SUNY CHANCELLOR'S AWARDS



ELECTRONICS TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM

SUNY Niagara announced the launch of its new Electronics Technology program for the fall 2024 semester. This program is designed to prepare graduates for careers in the field of electronics with courses curated to target skill sets used by modern electrical technicians.



PRESIDENT'S CUP AWARD

The 2024 President's Cup Award was presented to sophomore baseball standout Matthew Procopio.

The President's Cup is the most distinguished award in SUNY Niagara intercollegiate athletics. It is presented to a student who excels both on the field and in the classroom.



SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY EARNS 100% ON NATIONAL CERTIFICATION EXAM

SUNY Niagara celebrated a historic achievement for its Surgical Technology program. The graduating class of 2024 marks a first in the program's history, with the entire student cohort earning a passing grade on the National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting (NBSTSA) Certified Surgical Technologist (CST) exam.



STUDENT SHOWCASE

The college had an amazing turnout for its annual Student Showcase. Students presented passion projects that were developed under the mentorship of faculty and staff. Topics included fine arts, pastry arts, genetics, mental health, massage therapy, animation, anatomy and more.



CPR GOES VIRTUAL

Russell Crispell, an adjunct professor at SUNY Niagara, is using virtual reality (VR) to revolutionize CPR training. By immersing students in simulated life-threatening scenarios, Crispell is providing a more engaging and realistic learning experience.

With funding from the college, Crispell has developed a library of VR videos that place students in various first aid situations. These simulations allow students to practice their skills in a safe environment and develop a deeper understanding of how to respond effectively.



PHI THETA KAPPA ALL NEW YORK ACADEMIC AWARD

Congratulations to SUNY Niagara students Hang Tran, Sonya Arnold and Jacob Marra on their recognition for exemplary academic achievement in the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. State Senator Robert Ort presented them with their certificates in the New York State Capitol.



NEW WELDING FACILITY

In January 2023, SUNY Niagara announced the opening of its new metal fabrication and welding facility.

With a \$300,000 grant from the National Science Foundation, we were able to renovate existing space dedicated to the welding trade. The space includes a virtual welding machine that allows students to simulate various processes, one of only 10 robotic welders in Western New York, and an industrial processing lab.



EVENTS



SUNY NIAGARA REBRANDING

Niagara County Community College underwent a rebrand involving extensive research and collaboration. This change was all about making our college easier to recognize and understand. The college spent a lot of time talking to students, parents, teachers, staff, former students, and people in the community to get their ideas. Together, we created a brand that better represents who we are and what we do.

In introducing our new brand to the community, the college hosted a launch event on campus with music, food, drinks and giveaways with the new SUNY Niagara logo. Between 400-425 guests attended. The sentiment following the event was overwhelmingly positive, and the feedback the Public Relations office received surrounding the event was encouraging. A member of the NCCC Foundation board of trustees and college donor added after the event that it was, “an honor to be there to see all the students take part in the festivities.”

In the following months, SUNY Niagara’s operations department got to work updating key campus infrastructure with the new imagery, including road signs, banners, wayfinding signs and more.





ECLIPSE

NASA chose SUNY Niagara as a site for a variety of presentations and exhibits related to the April 8 solar eclipse. Janet Petro, director of the Kennedy Space Center, and NASA Astronaut Jeremy Hansen visited the college's Sanborn campus to speak, capping an impressive slate of events centered around the eclipse.



SUNY CHANCELLOR VISITS JOHN R. OISHEI CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

SUNY Chancellor John B. King visited SUNY Niagara to announce a \$1.72 million investment in expanding childcare centers across SUNY campuses.

Chancellor King said, "Having that college degree is more important than ever to compete for good jobs in New York's rapidly evolving workplaces, and for many of our students, services like child care are essential for them to earn their spot at graduation."



CULINARY DEMONSTRATIONS ON DAYTIME BUFFALO

Niagara Falls Culinary Institute Chef Emily Lonigan began a weekly segment on Daytime Buffalo, a local television show. Chef Lonigan demonstrates how to make culinary and pastry delicacies in your own kitchen. Dishes featured have included andouille and sweet potato hash, upside down tacos, bacon egg bites, cake mix cookies, cherry galette and peanut butter chocolate icebox pie.



JORDAN POYER VISITS SUNY NIAGARA

Jordan Poyer, a former All-Pro safety for the Buffalo Bills, visited SUNY Niagara in September for a discussion about his battle with alcohol addiction and path to recovery. The event was open to the community and included a question and answer session.



2ND ANNUAL CANNABIS CONFERENCE

SUNY Niagara hosted the 2nd annual SUNY Cannabis Conference in January. This two-part event delved into the blossoming cannabis industry, providing attendees with valuable insights from industry leaders and networking opportunities.

The conference began Jan. 8 with a half-day program dedicated to the culinary applications of cannabis. Held at the Niagara Falls Culinary Institute, this event featured a CBD-infused lunch and a light dinner. The day also included the first-ever, nationally sanctioned, American Culinary Federation culinary cannabis competition, showcasing the creativity and skill of talented chefs and their use of culinary cannabis.

On Jan. 9, the conference shifted to the Sanborn campus. That day's program focused on the latest research, technology and opportunities within the New York state cannabis industry. The program featured presentations from leading experts, including those from conference Gold Sponsor, the Dent Cannabis Research Center, across a variety of fields including medical applications, cannabis genetics, processing technology, and human resources.



COMMENCEMENT 2024

In May, SUNY Niagara celebrated the achievements of 711 graduates, with 322 crossing the stage during the commencement ceremony. The event featured a keynote address by Thomas J. Quatroche, Jr., president of Erie County Medical Center, who inspired graduates as they embarked on their next chapter.



NURSING PINNING CEREMONY

The SUNY Niagara Nursing Pinning Ceremony in May marked a significant milestone for 78 graduates. The ceremony honored the hard work and dedication of the graduating class, recognizing its commitment to patient care. Graduates recited the Nightingale Pledge and received their pins, a symbol of their professional journey.

The course, English 102: Writing II and Introduction to Literature, reinforces writing skills and introduces students to the study of literature.




STUDENT VOTER REGISTRATION

NIAGARA COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY CONSTRUCTION




FREE TAX ASSISTANCE

3 NJCAA REGION III CHAMPIONSHIPS

Wrestling


The wrestling program won the Region III title for the 26th time in school history. The Thunderwolves had four individuals – Joseph Florance, Michael Catanzaro, Renso Montalvo and Kace Cook – qualify for the NJCAA Championships in Council Bluffs, Iowa. Cook finished in eighth place in his weight class, becoming the 55th All-American in program history.

Women's Basketball

The women's basketball program won 27 games and a sixth consecutive Region III championship. The Thunderwolves had five players – Faith Alessandra, Rachel Kamrowski, Mia Little, Tessa Schuey and Krystal Smith – earn All-Region honors. Alessandra was also Region III Player of the Year, Region III Tournament MVP and an NJCAA Div. II All-American.

Men's Golf

The men's golf program earned its third regional championship in the past four seasons. All five members of the squad – Eliel Rodriguez, Adam Firkins, Ryan Kates, Teddy Swiech and Charlie Nuttle – picked up All-Region recognition. Firkins, meanwhile, was an NJCAA Div. III All-American after he led the Thunderwolves to a fourth-place finish at Nationals.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



LUMINA FOUNDATION MINI-GRANT BOOSTS PUBLIC RELATIONS

The PR office won a \$50,000 mini-grant award from the Lumina Foundation to support efforts to generate innovative brand awareness and procure specialized photography equipment to enhance the college's digital presence. The funds will enable PR to further its digital marketing campaign through social media, audio, paid search, and other digital marketing tactics.

NYSED - PTECH COMPUTER SCIENCE GRANT 2023-2030

Niagara Falls City School District and North Tonawanda City School District each in partnership with SUNY Niagara submitted for \$2.3 million and \$3.3 million, respectively, in funding to implement a new Computer Technology career-preparation pathway for 272 students, culminating in A.A.S. degrees in computer science (including computer hardware and software engineering) or computer information systems. SUNY Niagara was selected as a partner for its ability to prepare students for careers in computer science, its proximity to both districts and expertise in administering successful PTECH programs. The college offers an extensive support system to ensure that students with diverse educational needs can be successful. Careers in these fields are anticipated to remain in high-demand throughout the region over the next 10 years. This pathway also provides a foundation for four-year degrees in several fields if graduates choose to continue their education.

GRANTS

The Grants Office managed over \$3.7 million in grant funding during the most recently completed fiscal year. Thirty-three grant applications, totaling \$4.3 million in funding requests were made in 2023 - 2024.

VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK UNVEILING

The college's annual Veterans Day ceremony took on deeper meaning in 2023 with the dedication of the Veterans Memorial Park. Designed to be a focal point for visitors driving onto the campus, the park features a reflection wall commemorating military heroes who have had an association with NCCC, large American and New York state flags, a POW/MIA flag and emblems of all six branches of the U.S. military.

The new park also incorporates the monument from an earlier memorial to veterans. In April 1976, the college's board of trustees approved a site on campus to recognize servicemen and women. The college, Niagara County Community College Veterans Association and a host of dignitaries and officials gathered to dedicate a memorial park later that year.

Over 100 sponsors contributed nearly \$250,000 to the Veterans Memorial Park project. The college was honored to host New York State Senator Robert Ort, who delivered the keynote address on the occasion of its opening.
