Keep in mind: These awards are **NOT** funded by SUNY Niagara, and application dates/disbursement of funds would be up to the awarding party.

Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo Scholarship

Award: Up to \$6,000 Eligibility: The candidate must be a permanent resident in one of the eight counties of WNY (Allegany, Chautauqua, Cattaraugus, Erie, Genesee, Niagara, Orleans, and Wyoming). They must have at least a 2.0 GPA and be accepted to any accredited non-profit college or university in the United States for full-time study at the undergraduate level. NYS Organization of Bursars and Business Administrators Scholarship

Award: \$1,000 Eligibility: The candidate must be registered for at least half time at *a member school* and have completed at least 15 credit hours of college coursework, in good academic standing, and enrolled in a degree-granting program. <u>Student Instructions and Application</u>

Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society Scholarships

Volunteer Firefighter Tuition Reimbursement Program (FASNY HELP)

New York's volunteer fire departments are currently experiencing a critical need to recruit and retain members. As an incentive for people to serve, FASNY has developed the Higher Education Learning Plan (FASNY HELP). This program provides tuition reimbursement to individuals attending community college for up to eighty (80) credit hours. Under FASNY HELP, student-volunteers are eligible to have up to 100% of their tuition reimbursed in exchange for maintaining their grades and fulfilling defined service requirements. They must also be a "member in good standing" in one of New York's volunteer fire companies during both their school years and service payback period. Higher Education Services Corporation (HESC) Scholarships:

ExcelsiorThis program covers tuition for eligible SUNY and CUNY students. The
program began in 2017 and will be phased in over three years. It first applied
to families who earned \$100,000 or less, then who earned \$110,000 or less in
2018, and it will eventually reach \$125,000 or less in 2019.

EnhancedThis program enables students attending private colleges to receive financial
assistance to complete their college degree. The program provides a maximum
award of \$3,000, requires private colleges to provide a match and freeze
student tuition for the duration of the award – maximizing the financial benefit
to the student.

Military Enhanced Recognition Incentive and Tribute - MERIT Scholarship, also known as Military Service Recognition Scholarship (MSRS)

Provides financial aid to children, spouses and financial dependents of members of the United States Armed Forces or of a state organized militia who, at any time on or after Aug. 2, 1990, while a New York State resident, died or became severely and permanently disabled while engaged in hostilities or training for hostilities. For study in New York State.

New York State Achievement and Investment in Merit Scholarship (NY-AIMS)	The New York State Achievement and Investment in Merit Scholarship (NY-AIMS) provides high school graduates who excel academically with \$500 in merit- based scholarships to support their cost of attendance at any college or university located in New York State.
<u>New York State Part-time</u> <u>Scholarship (PTS) Award</u>	The New York State Part-Time Scholarship Award Program provides scholarship awards to students who attend a SUNY or CUNY Community College part- time and maintain a 2.0 GPA. Students can receive \$1,500 per semester for up to 2 years.
<u>NYS Child Welfare Worker</u> <u>Incentive Scholarship Program</u>	The NYS Child Welfare Worker Incentive Scholarship Program grants awards for child welfare workers employed at voluntary not-for-profit child welfare agencies licensed by the NYS Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS). Recipients must agree to live in NYS and work at a voluntary not-for-profit child welfare agency licensed by OCFS for 5 years after graduation, and can use the award to get an associate's, bachelor's or graduate degree for not more than 2 years, 4 years, and 2 years, respectively.
<u>NYS Math and Science Teaching</u> <u>Incentive Scholarship</u>	Provides grants to eligible full-time undergraduate or graduate students in approved programs that lead to math or science teaching careers in secondary education.
NYS Memorial Scholarship for Families of Deceased Firefighters, Volunteer Firefighters, Police Officers, Peace Officers, and Emergency Medical Service Workers	Provides financial aid to children, spouses and financial dependents of deceased firefighters, volunteer firefighters, police officers, peace officers, and emergency medical service workers who have died as the result of injuries sustained in the line of duty in service to the State of New York. For study in New York State.

NYS Scholarships for Academic Excellence Awarded to outstanding graduates from registered New York State high schools. Awards are based on student grades in certain Regents exams. For up to five years of undergraduate study in New York State. NYS Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Incentive Program The NYS STEM Incentive Program provides awards for full-time study up to the annual tuition charged to NYS resident students attending an undergraduate program at the State University of New York (SUNY), or actual tuition charged, whichever is less, for the top 10 percent of students in each New York State high school if they pursue a STEM degree in an associates or bachelor degree program and agree to work in a STEM field in New York State for 5 years after graduation.

<u>NYS World Trade Center</u> <u>Memorial Scholarship</u>

Senator Patricia K. McGee Nursing Faculty Scholarship Guarantees access to a college education for the families and financial dependents of the victims who died or were severely and permanently disabled in the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks and the resulting rescue and recovery efforts.

The Senator Patricia K. McGee Nursing Faculty Scholarship program seeks to increase the number of educators and adjunct clinical faculty teaching nursing education in New York State.

ROTC SCHOLARSHIPS:

Apply for an ROTC scholarship through the <u>ROTC Office at Niagara</u> <u>University</u>.

Students must meet certain academic and medical standards, be interviewed by military officials, and be willing to serve up to four years of active duty as an officer after graduation. Entry into active duty after graduation may be deferred to obtain an advanced degree at the student's own expense.

The award may be for two or three years for a sophomore or a freshman, respectively. Recipients receive 80 percent of expenses, or \$7,500, whichever is greater, for tuition and all required university fees; a flat-rate fee of \$450 annually for textbooks and supplies; plus \$100 per month for up to ten months of the academic year.
