Honors Contract

To complete the contract, students work in close collaboration with the professor to establish a project or conduct research that goes *above and beyond* the regular course content; this is not a project that is part of the course's regular curriculum. Several times a semester the student and professor should meet to track the progress of the contract, in order to ensure that the student is completing the project to the professor's satisfaction and at an Honors level.

Students should be encouraged to present their contract project to the class and at the Student Showcase during spring Open House.

The contract project, and the decision to allow a student to undertake an honors contract, is at the discretion of the professor.

Honors Projects Requirements:

Honors projects should aim to meet 4 of the 6 Honors Students Learning Outcomes:

- Exhibit critical reading with understanding, writing with clarity, and listening and speaking effectively.
- Understand and apply the techniques of scientific inquiry to problem solving.
- Use systematic, logical, critical, and creative processes to identify problems, research, propose and evaluate alternative solutions.
- Identify connections across disciplines.
- Examine an instructor-approved topic or problem through the term that culminates in a scholarly or creative product that is presented to the class.
- Reflect on work by professional creators or scholars, by peers, and by the student to articulate those connections.

The student must earn a B grade in the regular course AND a B grade on the Contract project.

The professor may also impose additional requirements that the student must fulfill in order to complete the contract. Once the contract option has been discussed with the professor, the contract form must be completed and turned in to the Honors Coordinator no later than the third week of classes.

Students must be admitted into the Honors Institute to undertake an Honors contract. Faculty member must be a full-time employee of the college (Part time faculty should contact Honors Coordinator to discuss project and time commitment required).

Honor students are encouraged to present their project at the NCCC Student Showcase.
