immediately adjacent to and accessible from the buildings and in the On-Campus Resident Halls. The Annual Security & Fire Safety Report discloses information concerning campus safety and security policies and

procedures, as well as statistics regarding certain types of crimes reported to the campus and local law enforcement during the prior calendar year.

The Annual Security & Fire Safety Report discloses fire safety policies and fire statistics for on-campus student housing facilities. Among other things, the report discusses fire safety systems, fire drills, rules relating to portable

electrical appliances, evacuation, and fire safety training. Together, these reports provide students, prospective students, employees, and prospective employees with key information regarding the security of the campus and surrounding areas, and ultimately, create a safer, more secure campus environment.


